BACKGROUND

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) will be discussed in multiple fora in the coming months, including during the 78th Session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA78), highlighted by the <u>SDG Summit</u>.

Now through UNGA78, USAID will prioritize messaging on the United States' support for the SDGs when possible and appropriate in order to showcase U.S. commitment to constructive engagement with partners to tackle global challenges and advance the SDGs.

In advance of the SDG Summit in September, and in the lead up to UNGA High-Level Week, USAID has collaborated with the U.S. Mission to the United Nations (USUN) on a photo exhibition that showcases the United States' commitment to the SDGs. The photos will be displayed in the windows of the USUN building in New York City across from the United Nations, along with a QR code to link to a <u>USAID</u> landing page where viewers can access the stories represented by each image.
